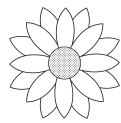
Thank you to all the volunteers who helped with the bookfair. We could not have done it without all your help. We feel like it was very successful! Several books were donated to classroom libraries as well!

It was a very moving moment. Also, Dave Rubie, last year's Crownhill PTA President, spoketo the board and asked them to reinstate the lost services in next years budget.
